

Profile Chair by Zaishu

Zaishu connects the worlds of art and design by collaborating with artists to create functional limited edition objects. Founded by creative duo Matthew Butler and Helen Punton Zaishu celebrates cultural diversity, creativity and responsible design practises.

Our first object / installation, a Japanese inspired slot together seat, made from plantation grown veneer with water based inks and varnish was launched at ACCA in 2004. We have since travelled to Italy, Sweden, Germany and India to work with artists hosting workshops and exhibitions.

This year we introduce the 'Profile Chair'. A comfortable upholstered sculptural form inviting artists to work with the fabric as a new medium for their work.

Size: 730mm H x 730mm W x 770mm D

Fabric required per chair: 2.4m x 1.4m

Stitching options: Normal seam or reversed (inside out) seam.

Construction: Plantation Hardwood, Good Environmental Choice Certified foam.
